

Health Ministry Leader Team Draft Position Description¹

- 1. Title of team: Health Ministry Leader Team
- 2. *Purpose of team*: Facilitate the process for ______ (name of specific church) becoming and/or maintaining itself as a Center for Health and Healing².
- 3. Reports to: Clergy and church leadership council
- 4. Relates closely with: Clergy and other ministry teams
- 5. Team responsibilities may vary depending on the specifics of any particular church. Below is a responsibility set to be considered:
 - a. Become more informed on health and healing from a biblical and good science perspective.
 - b. In a variety of ways, actively teach the congregation what learned through 5a.
 - c. Through formal and/or informal methods identifies the health ministry needs of the congregation and the community it serves.
 - d. Through formal and/or informal methods identifies the health ministry resources of the congregation and the community it serves.
 - e. Assist existing health ministries to maximize effectiveness.
 - f. Help launch new health ministries as needed.
 - g. Carry out select health ministry activities³.
- 6. Team gifts, talents, and attributes:
 - a. Mature and or growing Christian faith
 - b. Interest in health and healing (health professions background not required)
 - c. Balanced representation of clergy, health professionals, and laity.
 - d. Balanced age representation of all age groups including youth.
 - e. Balanced representation of men and women
- 7. Approximate team member time commitment: 2-4 hours per month
- 8. *Term of member position*: 1 2 years
- 1. Position description may be modified according to the specific needs of your church.

- 3. For the purpose of this document a health ministry activity tends to be a single event or a short series. A health ministry tends to be more of an on-going happening (e.g. daily, weekly, monthly or even yearly).
